2010 Dolores Saunders retired after serving the children of Canfield for 41 years. Mrs. Saunders taught in all four the Canfield Schools. Many of our Canfield Staff had the opportunity to grow as students under Mrs. Saunders' supervision.

Winter of 2010 C.H. Campbell fourth graders teamed up with the rest of C.H. Campbell and Hilltop Elementary to raise funds for Shelter Box. Together the schools raised over \$8,500.00 to help supply people of Haiti with shelter after the devastating earthquakes. Each box supplies an extended family of up to 10 people with a tent and lifesaving equipment to use while they are displaced or homeless.

Canfield Village Middle School has participated in the "Cans for Canfield" activity yearly. This program was developed by one of our teachers, Mrs. Vicki Latimer, and has raised thousands of dollars so far to refurbish our school track. We have been awarded first place in Mahoning County's recycling program for this and also received a second place award in the nation for our recycling program.

2009-10

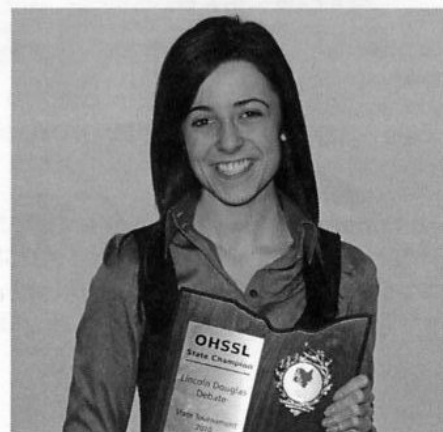
- First Place overall winner "Cash for Cans" (Green Team) - \$1,504.75.
